We require a dynamic, motivated and engaging teacher of acting and public speaking, with proven excellence, to teach students in the Senior School. The Visiting LAMDA Teacher will be expected to liaise directly with parents of the pupils to arrange lessons, payment and report on progress.

Department Information

Within the Drama curriculum, we offer a broad range of activities that enables all students to fully develop their potential and interests. We also believe passionately that in Drama lessons, students will develop wider life skills such as self-confidence, thinking on-the-go, discipline, imagination, and an ability to cope with deadlines.

Drama is popular at GCSE and A-Level, and students regularly go on to courses at leading universities and conservatoires, often following this with top careers in the creative industries. Wherever students end up, in the business or not, we endeavour to give them all a positive Drama experience at Kingswood.

Key duties & responsibilities

- To teach Drama and Public Speaking to pupils on a 1-1 basis and in pairs, from beginners to advanced level;
- Be an excellent role model to pupils and set high expectations for progress and enjoyment;
- Enter pupils for exams and performances as appropriate;
- Organise a weekly timetable rotation for pupils and liaise with the administrative support team on lesson organisation matters;
- To communicate effectively with parents of pupils and the school as appropriate;
- Preparation of a mid-year and end of year report to parents.

It should be noted that this is not a definitive list; your duties will be at least those listed above.



You will be expected to:

- Conduct yourself with professionalism, tact and diplomacy at all times as a representative of Kingswood
