# Sports Department

Sport is central to school life and the children benefit from access to a range of facilities on site and in the local area, including those at Alleyn's School, as well as coaching by specialist staff, supported by some class teachers. As well as curriculum time provision, sport plays a significant role in the co-curricular life of the school. Clubs and training sessions are used to develop the skills of every pupil, as well as to prepare for upcoming fixtures. Children enjoy their sport and many play outside of school. Parents are very supportive of the school's ethos towards sport which is built around a late specialisation model, creating rounded and confident sports performers and enabling children to participate and compete at a level appropriate to them. Sport is often delivered with boys and girls working together in line with our co-educational ethos. However, where appropriate, groups may be split by gender for certain activities. The quest for positive results and on-field successes are encouraged and celebrated but sit within the broader context of playing sport for enjoyment, for health and in a way that promotes the team, as well as the individual. The School views sporting development as providing the foundations for sport in senior schools and beyond.

Sport at the school utilises Alleyn's Oakfield, the Edward Alleyn Club grounds, Belair Park and the swimming pool at Alleyn's School.

Teams are fielded regularly across year groups, ability groups and genders in football, cross country and netball, with hockey, cricket, and swimming in development. The school has a particular strength in gymnastics.

During the year there are many house sporting events. These internal and external competitive environments allow pupils to grow in line with our school ROCCK values.

Sporting fixtures are held against local schools, of which there are a great many, both in the independent and maintained sector and we regularly host sporting events as well as attending some local, regional and national competitions.

The older children each receive one PE/swimming lesson per week for half a year (80 minutes) and one games lesson per week (80 minutes) with an additional one in the non-swimming terms. This is augmented by many co-curricular sports clubs over the course of each week from pre-school running/cricket clubs, lunchtime clubs and after school clubs. The majority of fixtures are either played during games lessons or after school with a very small number of sporting events at weekends. These teams are shared by all of those involved in the teaching and coaching of sport, but specialist sports staff will take a greater number of fixtures.

The department is led by a Head of Sport and there are currently two other full-time sports staff and one part-time Sports Coach. We make use of the Alleyn's School swimming staff. Together, this team take most of the PE and swimming lessons and then are assisted by some class teachers who support games lessons.

The sports staff share an office from which they can plan and organise.



# About The Role

We are looking for an individual with a genuine passion for sport, strong practical knowledge, and the ability to coach confidently across a range of activities. The successful candidate will work with pupils across the full primary age range and contribute to a broad and vibrant curriculum.

Our sports provision includes substantial programmes in Football, Hockey, Netball, Cricket, Swimming, Tennis, Gymnastics and Athletics. We are therefore seeking someone who can support and enhance this wide-ranging offer, bringing enthusiasm, professionalism and a commitment to high-quality coaching for pupils of varying abilities.

We welcome applications from candidates with experience across multiple sports. Above all, we are looking for someone who will contribute positively to our collaborative and energetic department and who is committed to fostering a love of sport in young people.

## Duties and Responsibilities:

### Planning, Teaching and Class Management

- Attend all relevant staff meetings, briefing and planning meetings and work collaboratively with the Sports Department under the management of the Head of Sport;
- Adhere to school policies and schemes of work in all areas of the curriculum taught;
- Identify clear teaching objectives and specify how they will be taught and assessed;
- Set tasks which challenge and inspire pupils;
- Help to identify and support SEND, bilingual, EAL and very able pupils;
- Provide clear structures for lessons maintaining pace, motivation and challenge;
- Make effective use of assessment and ensure coverage of programmes of study;
- Maintain discipline in accordance with the school's procedures and encourage good practice with regard to punctuality, behaviour and standards of performance;
- Ensure pupils acquire and consolidate knowledge, skills and understanding appropriate to the subject taught;
- Evaluate own learning critically to improve effectiveness;
- Promote the school's values, encouraging pupils to think and talk about their learning, develop self-control and independence, concentration and perseverance, and listen attentively;
- Embrace established teaching and learning cultures and initiatives that are promoted within the school and marry these with your own style;
- Accompany school trips, including a residential trip in the Trinity Term.

### Pastoral Care

- Promote the safeguarding, welfare and safety of all pupils at all times;
- Adhere to school pastoral, welfare and safeguarding policies and procedures;
- Actively support the pastoral care of the children and communicate any relevant news or concerns about them to relevant staff;
- Maintain notes regarding pupil concerns and incidents on the school's database.



### Monitoring, Assessment, Recording, Reporting

- Assess how well learning objectives have been achieved and use them to improve specific aspects of teaching;
- Assess and monitor pupils' development and set targets for progress;
- Provide the Head of Sport with information for their reports to parents and parent consultations.

### Duties and Co-Curricular

- Cover lessons as timetabled by the Head of Sport;
- Carry out break and lunch time duties as directed;
- Support in the process of assessment and pupil recruitment events as expected of all staff, e.g. Open Day, assessment days on non-school days, which sometimes fall on a Saturday;
- Be involved in special school events outside regular school hours such as Founder's Day, the Year 6 play, Infant Nativity, etc;
- Contribute fully to the co-curricular life of the school;
- Organise and support sports events such as tournaments.

### Curriculum Development and Professional Development

- Contribute to the whole school's planning activities;
- Understand the relevant areas of the National Curriculum;
- Attend pre-term staff INSET and appropriate courses and training to further professional development, including first aid training.

### General

- Be aware of the school's Health and Safety Policy;
- In conjunction with all staff of the school, support, promote and act within the School's policies and practices about data protection, Health and Safety, and the school's Safeguarding Policy;
- Promote the school's eco-agenda and ensure all work is carried out with a view to reducing waste and protecting our environment;
- Any additional duties, as directed by the Head of Sport or the Head which are within reasonable capability of the post holder.

## Line Management

The Sports Coach will report directly to the Head, working collaboratively with the Head of Sport.

## Person Specification

The successful applicant should:

- Understand and espouse child protection practice and be committed to safeguarding and promoting the welfare of children;

- Be committed to the values of Alleyn's and independent education and willing to play a full part in the life of the school;

- Promote fairness and equality of opportunity amongst the children and believe passionately that all children should be valued equally;
- Be a good listener with children and adults, open and approachable;
- Be flexible whilst adhering steadfastly to important principles;
- Display initiative, creativity and a growth mindset;
- Possess determination, enthusiasm and stamina;

# Working at Alleyn's

## Terms and Conditions

The position is a one term fixed term contract to coach sports (Reception to Year 6) based at Alleyn's Oakfield in Dulwich. It will commence in the Advent Term on Thursday 3 September 2026 and conclude on Wednesday 16 December 2026. It is offered on a full time basis of 35 hours per week, although part time arrangements will be considered. Final working hours will be confirmed at interview.

There may also be opportunities to take on additional coaching work during holiday courses, as well as the potential to coach in the Senior School, subject to experience and availability.

The salary will be dependent on experience and qualifications. The post is subject to a six-months probationary period.

The school offers additional benefits to its staff, including an employee assistance programme, enhanced family leave pay, lunches and other refreshments, the use of school facilities including the swimming pool and gym, a cycle-to-work scheme, a tech scheme, access to the library, free tickets to school performances, and the opportunity to join one of two private healthcare plans. Staff also enjoy discounts with local businesses and may use the Alleyn's Holiday Camp for the children of staff between Year 1 and Year 6 at a preferential rate.

Members of staff who have children attending Alleyn's Oakfield and/or Senior School will benefit from 25% fee remission which, subject to means testing, may increase to a maximum of 85%. This is a non-taxable benefit, and any means-tested element is reviewed annually. Staff children must meet the same admissions criteria as all pupils at Alleyn's. There is also some fee remission available in respect of staff children attending Dulwich College and James Allen's Girls' School, though the terms and conditions are different and it is taxable benefit.

The role holder will have access to, and may be automatically enrolled into, the School's Group Personal Pension Plan, currently provided by Legal & General. Further details regarding employer contributions will be provided upon appointment.

On completion of the required recruitment checks, the post will be available to the successful candidate from Thursday 3 September 2026.

## Commitment to Safeguarding

We are fully committed to providing a safe environment for children, staff and visitors.
